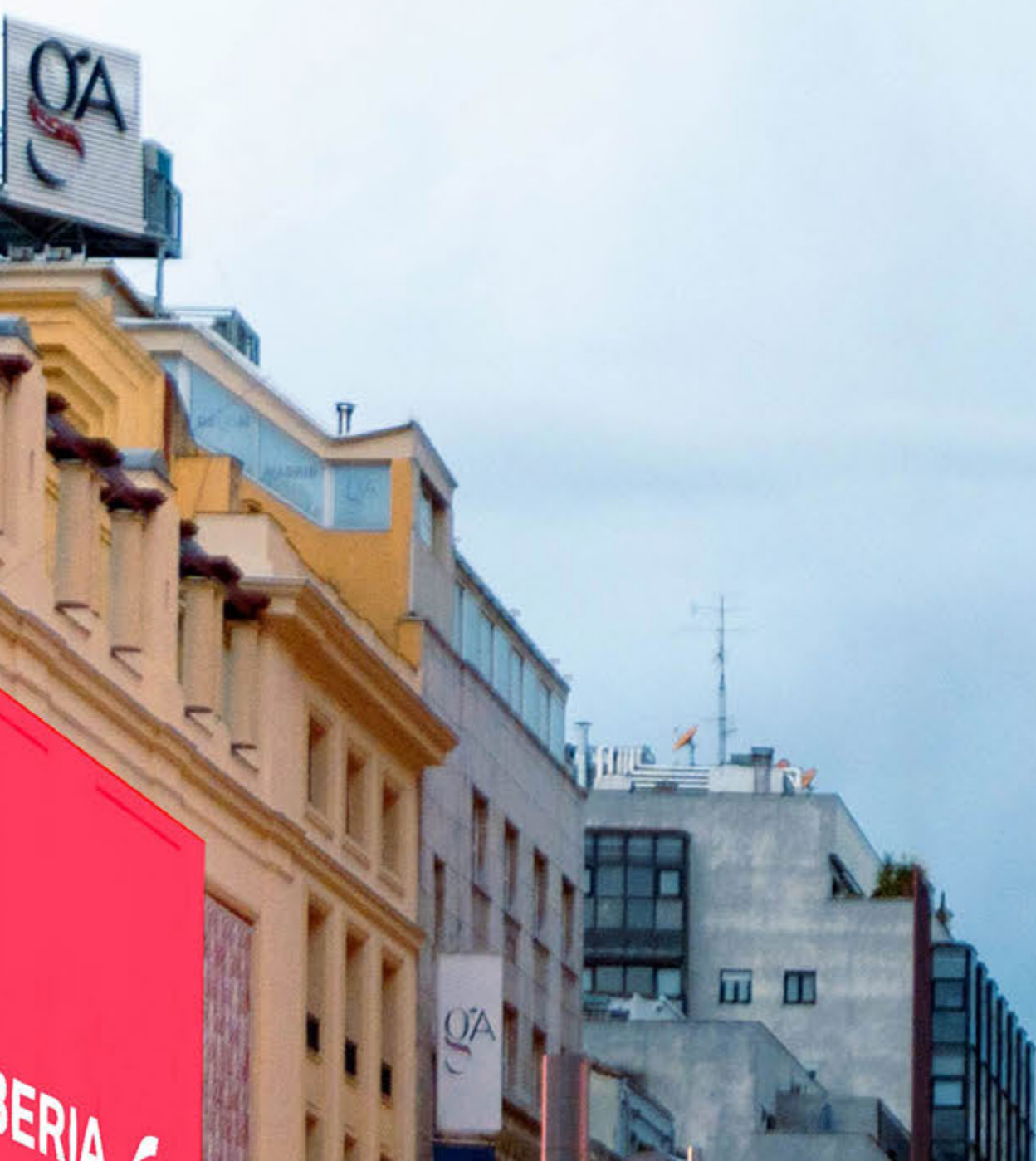


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Stopover Hola Madrid 2-day route

Day 1 of 2

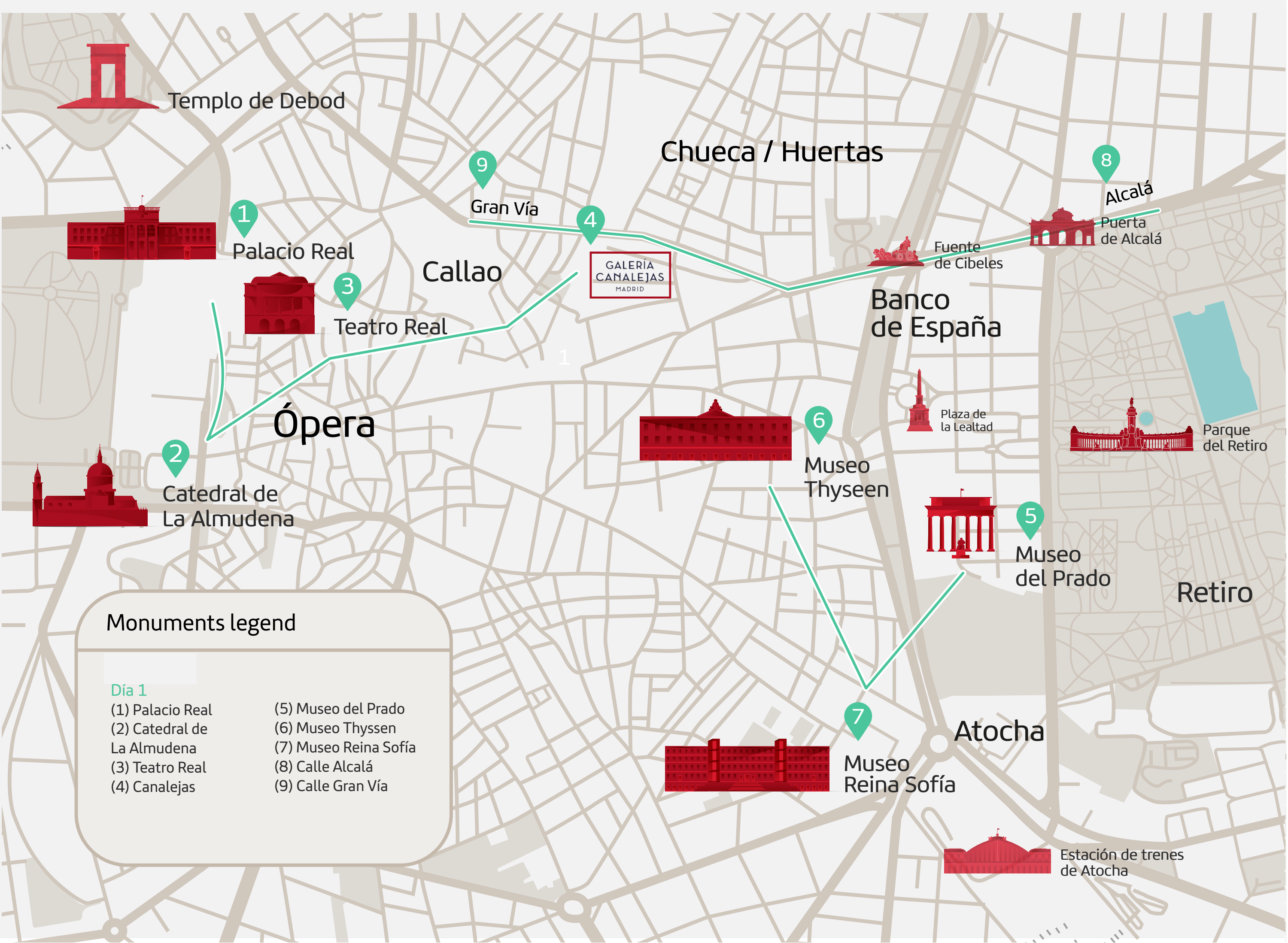
Morning: Start the day with a visit to **Madrid's Royal Palace (1)**, one of the most emblematic places in the city. Next, head to the viewpoint between the Palace and the **Almudena Cathedral (2)** for a panoramic view of the surroundings.

Take a stroll through Plaza de Oriente to the Sabatini Gardens and then straight ahead to the **Teatro Real (3)**, one of world's most important opera houses which is also open to the public.

At lunchtime, pop into **Galerías Canalejas (4)** to see more than 17,000 historical pieces that have been restored with traditional techniques, some of them almost extinct. Here you can also enjoy some unique culinary experiences with your **Stopover Hola Madrid fare**, but remember to book them in advance.

Afternoon/evening: Head to the **Museo del Prado (5)**, one of the world's leading art galleries, and explore the vast collection of works by European old masters like Goya, Velázquez and Hieronymus Bosch. Don't miss the nearby **Museo Thyssen-Bornemisza (6)** and the **Museo Reina Sofía (7)**, specialised in modern and contemporary art.

Night: Walk from **Calle Alcalá to the Gran Vía (8-9)**, Madrid's main shopping and leisure street lined with theatres offering shows and musicals, and while you're there, admire the wonderful architecture and lighting of the buildings. Take advantage of another discount and book tickets for one of the top musicals.

Day 2 of 2

Morning: Start the day exploring the historic centre of Madrid from **Puerta del Sol (1)**, the city's central square and kilometre 0 of Spain's national roads. You'll also find the famous clock that strikes midnight on New Year's Eve.

From there, head to **Plaza Mayor (2)**, a beautiful square surrounded by historical buildings, and then explore the Barrio de las Letras or "literary quarter", once home to famous writers and nowadays a bustling area filled with cafes, restaurants, boutiques and bookshops.

At lunchtime, make your way to the **Gourmet Experience space at El Corte Inglés de Serrano (3)**, where you can also take advantage of discounts on both fashion and food with your **Stopover Hola Madrid fare**.

Afternoon/evening: Head to the famous **Puerta de Alcalá (4)**, one of the few gateways to the city still standing, and then enter the **Parque del Retiro (5)**, where you take a boat out on the lake or stroll through the gardens and discover charming attractions like the **Palacio de Cristal**, a beautiful glass building that hosts temporary art exhibitions, and the park's numerous statues.

Night: Explore one of the pavement cafes along **Gran Vía (6)** that serve dinner or cocktails, such as the Círculo de Bellas Artes or the Palacio de Cibeles.
